THEME: And A Child Shall Lead Them



Parents particularly, know how defenseless and fragile children are. That is why God loves children very much, as Jesus showed us in his whole life. Jesus tells us even how we have to become like little children, not that we have to become childish but that like little children we must be spontaneous, open and simple. Children do not ask for their due; they expect things from others and they accept everything as a gift. In the same way we must be open to the gifts of God and of people. People are God's gift to us too. Children symbolize the beginning of life; so everything should be ahead for us, too, as we go forward with Jesus as our guide.

MEDITATE: To learn from Jesus, we must lay aside our own ambitions, our fears, and sometimes our own dreams.

ACT: Determine how you can be more attentive to the teachings of Jesus in your daily life. Follow this practice faithfully each day for the coming week.

SEPTEMBER 20th: SAINT ANDREW KIM TAE-GON & COMPANIONS

During the persecutions of 1839, 1846, 1866 and 1867 one hundred and three members of the Christian community gave their lives as martyrs. All suffered greatly for the faith and consecrated the rich beginnings of the Church in Korea with their blood as martyrs.



SEPTEMBER 21st: SAINT MATTHEW

Jesus spoke two simple words and Matthew's life was never the same again. "Follow me" the Lord said and Matthew followed, leaving behind him a secure job – though not a popular one for he was a tax collector. He is also the author of one of the four Gospels. In it he left us a full account of the life and teaching of Jesus. His symbol is a young man because he begins his Gospel with Christ's earthly ancestry and stresses His human and kingly character.



SEPTEMBER 24th: OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

In the year 1061, Our Lady appeared to a pious Norfolk lady, and asked her to build a replica of the house at Nazareth where the Annunciation took place. As a shrine of the Incarnation, Walsingham inspires us to allow God's will to direct our lives as Mary did, and to recognise the presence of Christ in the daily events of our lives.

NEW MASS SCHEDULE

As all Masses are now public, it is important that we continue to ensure that the Church remains a safe place where people gather to worship. The overriding principles continue to be that we need to maintain preventative practices to stop the spread of the disease: these include taking account of the prevailing local conditions, continuing to use sanitisers and wearing face masks [unless you are unable to do so for medical reasons], general cleaning to a good standard [with attention to frequent touchpoints], maintaining 1metre+ separation, good ventilation [**doors will remain open during Mass and the heating has to remain off**], registration of track and trace details [**we are still obliged to keep record of people attending**], and continuation of stewards at Mass. ASSISTED DYING BILL

This October, an 'Assisted Dying' Bill will be debated in the House of Lords. If successful it will allow a terminally ill adult with less than 6 months to live, assistance to commit suicide. The Catholic Church teaches that this represents a crime against human life, we cannot directly choose to take the life of another, even if they request it. The Bishops therefore urge you to **PRAY** this Bill is defeated, **WRITE** to Peers and MPs expressing concern about this proposed legislation and **SHARE** our resources and those of our allies, in the weeks ahead with family and friends, especially via social media.
